- 2. No attempt was made to carry the accuracy of reported percentages beyond two decimal places (.01); therefore segments of the population making up less than 0.5% were generally reported as 0%.
- 3. The percentages for Democrats, Republicans, and Independents were taken from the May 18, 1982 voter registration report. The & who voted and the number of registered voters in 1982 were taken from the post-election November 1982 report.
- 4. For neighborhoods in the City of Pittsburgh, voting data were reported for wards, which in general are not the same as neighborhoods.
- 5. Voter information for Pittsburgh SMSA is not available.
- 6. Party affiliation for Northview Heights is not available.
