HOUSING FOR ALL

Almost 30% of Allegheny households spent more than 30% of their income on housing costs, making it hard to afford other necessities like groceries, transportation, and health services ([IPUMS USA](#)). Allegheny County's government has several powers that could help people access and remain housed, such as operating a public housing authority and transitional housing for people experiencing homelessness and offering tax relief to help older adults stay in their homes.

STRONG AND EQUITABLE ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The unemployment rate in Allegheny County is at a historic low of 3.7%, and there are currently more job postings than there are unemployed people in the county ([Pennsylvania State Department of Labor](#)). However, around 38% of households in Allegheny County live below the poverty line or below the ALICE threshold, meaning that they earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living for the county and struggle to cover the costs of household essentials like housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, and a basic smartphone plan ([ALICE Pennsylvania Dashboard](#)). County government has several tools it can use to attract new employers, support local entrepreneurs, and support workers.

HEALTHY FAMILIES AND HIGH-QUALITY HUMAN SERVICES

One important indicator of health is life expectancy, and in Allegheny County the average Black resident has a life expectancy of just 71 years, down from 73 years in 2015 ([CDC WONDER | National Equity Atlas](#)). The average White resident in the county has a life expectancy of 78 years. One major contributor to lowered life expectancy is the opioid crisis: according to the most recent data from 2022, 689 people died from drug overdoses across Allegheny County. The County has several tools that could be used to reduce health disparities and improve the health of all residents, such as addressing the increasing access to overdose prevention services, making sure the county's food supply and environment are clean, hiring community health workers to connect individuals to available services, enrolling people in low-cost health insurance programs, and providing crisis services for people experiencing mental illness or substance use disorders.

17. Following a 2021 nationwide settlement with major pharmaceutical companies that inflamed the opioid crisis, counties and cities across the country are receiving money to prevent future public health emergencies related to opioids. RELIABLE, MODERN TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Pennsylvania has some of the oldest infrastructure in the county, and there are many needed repairs to bridges, roads, stormwater and wastewater systems across the state. For example, 51% of roads in Pennsylvania are in poor or fair condition ([American Society of Engineers Infrastructure Report Card](#)). Allegheny County could be eligible for hundreds of millions of dollars in federal funding for new infrastructure projects over the next several years.

The County works with many other entities – such as the Sheriff, the court system, the police and fire departments of every municipality – on strategies that are supposed to promote safety and justice.

SUSTAINABILITY, ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE, AND A GREEN ECONOMY

The average resident in Allegheny County is exposed to more cancer-causing air pollutants than 86% of residents in the rest of the United States ([U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, National Air Toxics Assessment](#)). The County has tools it can use to regulate pollution, upgrade buildings to be more sustainable, and grow and attract businesses that work towards cleaner air, water, and energy.

ROBUST EDUCATION, WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, AND YOUTH INVESTMENTS
